Carl's Comments - Reverend Carl Thompson

Spring is in the air; new life is breaking out all around us. Trees are producing new leaves while bluebonnets and other flowers spring up everywhere. This is my favorite time of year. We are about to leave the Lenten season of the liturgical year and move into the Easter season, the holiest season of the Christian year. We go from reflecting upon our own sinful nature and our mortality during Lent, to the hope of the resurrection. It is be-



cause of Jesus' death and resurrection that we too have the hope of eternal life. This hope is the center of our Christian faith. It is what all the other Biblical teachings are leading up to, that through Jesus we are a forgiven, redeemed people. We were once estranged from God, because of sin, but Jesus paid the price to bring us back into the family of God. This is the greatest gift we could ever receive.

This month we will celebrate Palm Sunday and Holy Week, a time when we remember the events of the last week of Jesus' life. Our Holy Week will begin with



Palm Sunday, include a special Maundy Thursday service, and end with our Sunday Easter service. On Maundy Thursday, the church remembers the last evening Jesus shared with his disciples in the upper room before his arrest and crucifixion. Maundy is derived from the Latin word mandatum, meaning "commandment," and refers to the commands Jesus gave his disciples at the Last Sup-

FROM SUFFERING TO SERVICE

I've been reading a book called "Resilient Faith" by Sheridan Voysey, an author, speaker, and broadcaster based in Oxford, U.K.

I like his writing so much and want to share some of his message with you. It seems particularly poignant as we approach Easter Sunday.



Sheridan was walking and talking with his friend Adrian, who posed this question. "Have you ever noticed how many people Jesus ministered to on the cross?" He continued. "He ministered to his mother (John19:26-27), to the thief crucified next to him (Luke 23:39-43), to the Roman officer who came to believe in him, and he ministered to us-forgiving our sins through his sacrifice. And all

of this was done in the middle of Jesus' suffering, before things became good at his resurrection." "For Jesus, crucifixion was a mission field," Adrian said. "And with him, our suffering, can be service to others too."

I have to say that I never really looked at the crucifixion in that way before. It gave me a lot to ponder. It isn't easy to think about ministering to others when you are in the midst of your own pain.

"He comforts us in all our troubles so that we can comfort others. When they are troubled, we will be able to give them the same comfort God has given us." - 2 *Corinthians 1:4.*

Call to Order - Rev. Carl Thompson 11:53 AM

Roll Call / Status of Quorum – Moderator, Rev. Carl Thompson, Acting Clerk and Treasurer, Pat Hart; Elders: Jeanette West, Sharon VanWinkle, Debby Aldridge, Mike Hart; Excused: Randy Kemp, Pat Rehm. - Quorum was approved.

Devotional/Opening Prayer – Pat Hart

Clerk of Session – Debby Aldridge moved that the minutes from the December 11, 2022, stated session meeting be approved; Shay VanWinkle seconded; motion approved. Mike Hart moved that the minutes of the January 29, 2023, Congregational meeting be approved; Debby Aldridge seconded; motion approved.

Treasurer's Report – February offerings were under budget but when you look at January and February together, we are over budget by \$2400, keeping in mind we always budget high for offerings the first two months because some families fulfill their total pledge for the year in Jan/Feb. Energy costs are still high but we are paying more than double per kWh than our old contract. Savings are steady at \$82,000, and we are expecting a Texas Presbyterian Foundation report mid-April.

Committee Reports:

Worship – Jeanette West reported that communion servers/side aisle sign up going well; Organ repair OK; Lisa Houston expected to play for Palm Sunday and Easter

Education - Mike Hart said that the women's devotional is ongoing on the third Thursdays. The Sunday School class is finishing Matt Rawle's book on the I AM statements of Jesus and will start Reckless Love by Tom Berlin after Easter. The men's group is studying Isaiah and has recently added two new members.



Building and Grounds – Carl reported for Randy Kemp that they hope to begin the work on the new roof next quarter. He is in the process of getting an estimate for a new cleaning service. He replaced a ballast in the choir room to get those lights working.

Fellowship – Shay VanWinkle thanked all the ladies who help her with the fellowship meals. The next one is a light meal for Maundy Thursday. There will be a 5th Sunday meal on April 30.

Benevolence – Mike Hart met with his committee recently. They cleaned up the giving list, dropping Families in Crisis and Helping Hands in Belton to keep the money in Salado. They also dropped the \$1000 per quarter we were giving to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance since our One Great Hour of Sharing goes to that. They divided \$3000 for first quarter giving among 5 different organizations.

Personnel/Finance – Debby Aldridge has recruited Evelyn Matthews and Laquita Arner to audit the books, which will be done in the next month or so.
