

THE CHRISTMAS STORY

This past Sunday Carl suggested that we read the Christmas story before Advent begins (in Luke chapters 1 & 2). I just finished. Last year about this time, after reading it, I wrote about Mary, the mother of Jesus. She is always on my mind during Advent. However, now I am thinking about Joseph. To me, and I would guess to a lot of people, he seems to be a minor figure in the story. He is just hovering in the background. But the truth of the matter is that he is not only a major character, so to speak, but is actually crucial to the unfolding story of the Nativity.

Let's just think about that for a minute. Let's think about the prophecies. We are told in Micah 5:2, "You, Bethlehem, least among the thousands of Judah, out of you HE shall come forth that is to become ruler of Israel." Jesus was to be descended from the line of King David. Joseph was from that line, and was from the tribe of Judah. Mary wasn't descended from royalty.

Joseph was the one who took them to Bethlehem, fulfilling Micah's prophecy about the birth of Jesus. Joseph found a place for Mary to give birth. Joseph was the one who guided then safely to Egypt, keeping the baby Jesus away from Herod and his son Archelaus, who sought to kill him. Joseph is the one who guided them safely back to Galilee. Joseph guarded and guided Jesus, and loved him like his own.

And Joseph was also obedient to the Lord, just as was Mary. He could have divorced her and sent her away. Under the law he had every right to do so. But he chose to be obedient, to trust in God, to take her as his wife, and protect and love her (and her child) as long as he lived.



(Isaiah 9:6) "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given; And the government shall be upon his shoulder; and his name shall be called Wonderful, the everlasting Father, Counsellor, the Mighty God, the Prince of Peace."



Recipe for Christmas Crack from Denice Kemp

1 to 1 ½ sleeves of saltine crackers

1 1/4 cups unsalted butter

1 ¼ cups light brown sugar

4 to 6 ounces Heath toffee bits

Bake crackers for 5 minutes.

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease or spray a 16 X 11 rimmed baking sheet. Then line pan with foil

or parchment so that it also comes up the sides.





Place a single layer of crackers to cover the pan. In a saucepan, add sugar and butter and heat till all melted and boiling. Continue to stir while mixture boils for 3 full minutes. After 3 minutes, pour the mixture over the crackers and place in oven.

Remove crackers from the oven and sprinkle with toffee bits while still hot. Allow crackers to cool completely, then break in pieces.
