

On another note, we will have an Ash Wednesday service on February 26 as we move




into the Lenten season. The noon service will be followed with a light lunch. I hope to see you all there. God Bless You. *Carl*

THE WINDOW

On Sunday mornings, when the choir has recessed, and I am sitting in the front row, I try to keep my eyes on the minister. It helps me to focus on the sermon. And I hope that it lets Carl know that I am paying attention and am really listening to whatever message he feels led to impart that day.

But there is an object behind him that frequently draws my attention. I find myself delighting in its beauty and thinking about its form and what it represents to me. The object I'm talking about is the stained glass window at the front of the sanctuary.

The colors are royal and glorious! The red is my favorite. And the form! I see the Triune God in that window. The flames represent the Holy Spirit. The top represents the "godhead." There are many people who are still persecuted and even killed for their belief in Jesus Christ, sometimes by their own families. I am so grateful to live in the United States of America. And so blessed every time I look at that stained glass window.




Comfort Food Pot Luck Social - 1/26/20
