Mission Giving in 2018

In 2018, our congregation donated funds among 18 different agencies, plus the One Great Hour of Sharing at Easter. Your Benevolence Committee met each guarter to continue to distribute about 25 percent of your total contributions for each period. At the year's end, we designated gifts to the Austin Theological Seminary, AWARE, the Body of Christ Clinics, Families in Crisis, Fisher House at Fort Hood, Heart & Hands Ministries, Helping Hands/ Belton, Presbyterian Children's Homes, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Salado Family Relief, Salado Fire Department, and Salvation Army/Temple. In the previous quarters, we had also included Children's Special Needs Network, Doctors without Borders, First Presbyterian Church of Rockport, Salvation Army/Greater Houston, Samaritan's Purse, Solar Under the Sun (a Presbyterian project by Synod of the Sun), and the purchase of \$25 Brookshire Brothers gift cards for Pastor Carl to give to needy travelers at his discretion.

In addition, our church allows Salado Family Relief to distribute both its end-of-summer school supplies & backpacks and its Christmas gifts for families with children from our activity room. At Thanksgiving, our members also took food and actively served at the Heart & Hands community meal. Throughout the year, members have also contributed to containers in our narthex for the Community Military Project of the SARW and to the Heart & Hands' pantry and clothing shop.
