We were going to San Antonio on Christmas Eve day to visit his brother and sister-inlaw, see their new house, celebrate Christmas with his whole family, and return home the day after Christmas. Just a few weeks ago, Jeanette, our choir director, asked if I would be singing with the choir on Christmas or Christmas Eve. I gave her a definite "No" and said that I would be in San Antonio. I also made the comment that I would love to sing "Mary Did You Know?" at some future date. A couple of weeks later she checked with me again about my plans for the holidays and I responded that I would be gone. At choir practice last Wednesday, I wished everyone a "Merry Christmas" and said that I would not be singing with them during the Christmas holidays. However, once again, "So, that was not going to happen".

Since all our plans for Christmas Eve had fallen through, we were able to come to church. I was so happy. I love the candlelight service, but usually miss it because we are out of town.

People were surprised to see me when I showed up in the choir room. But not nearly as surprised as I was when, about ten minutes before the service, I was informed that Rip, our scheduled soloist, had laryngitis. "So, that was not going to happen".

And guess what? He planned to sing "Mary, Did You Know"? If you were at church that night, you already know the rest of this story.



Yes, I agreed to sing it, despite the fact that I haven't sung it in a very long time, never in church, hadn't practiced at all, and wasn't sure if I remembered all the words.

So, it's a definite "Yes." "Yes", the Almighty hears us. He hears every word that we utter. He hears and knows every desire of our hearts, spoken or unspoken. And only God could have known how I would really spend my Christmas Eve.

Musical Notes



Session Meeting Minutes from December 11 - Pat Rehm

Presbyterian Church of Salado Stated Session Meeting Notes- Dec. 11 from 11:07am to 12:25pm

Present: Moderator, Rev. Carl Thompson; Clerk, Pat Rehm; Treasurer, Pat Hart; Ruling Elders: Randy Kemp, Debby Aldridge, Mike Hart, Jeanette West; Communications, Pete Stebbins.

Clerk 's Report - Pat Rehm

The annual update of the Church Rolls was started using a list of inactive members, and it will be completed after December 31st. One local family will be contacted, but others who have moved away will be removed. January 29, 2023 was selected as the date for the next congregational meeting, when annual reports from Elders will summarize highlights of this year.

Treasurer's Report - Pat Hart

In November the totals for income were \$6,135 and expenses were \$6,904, leaving a deficit for the month of \$509. Year to date, however, our income is \$27,359 ahead of expenses, with \$20,000 of that money invested in our Vanguard money market account. Educational funds remain adequate to purchase books needed through June.

Worship - Jeanette West

The Choir is now practicing at 3:30 PM on Wednesdays. Greeters are needed for this month, as well as Communion servers for January and succeeding months. The organ's switch needs repair. Communion dates were approved to continue the 1st Sunday of each month, plus having the Maundy Thursday service on April 6.

Education - Mike Hart

The Women's Devotional group has met since the summer Bible study ended in early September, and it will continue on the 3rd Thursday each month at 11:30 AM in the classroom. The Sunday School Class has completed Tom Berlin's *Courage* and has started Adam Hamilton's *Prepare the Way for the Lord*, an Advent study. The Men's Tuesday Prayer Breakfast group has finished the Book of Matthew and will read Adam Hamilton's *Incarnation* through Advent.

Building and Grounds - Randy Kemp

We are paying higher utility rates than our prior contract designated, and insurance costs have also increased. The new budget for 2023 allows for these adjustments. There were no significant repairs required in 2022, but the following projects were completed: AC Filters were replaced in June and December; the exterior lock at the fellowship access was repaired; and the light ballast in the Sunday School room was replaced. Major roof repairs are anticipated in 2023, as well as replacement of the exterior door in the Sunday School room.

Fellowship - Pastor Carl reporting for Shay VanWinkle There will be a social gathering after the Congregational Meeting on January 29, a 5th Sunday.

Communications - Pete Stebbins

He has now completed 128 *Messengers* going back to 2012. Plus he sends limited congregational updates, which are approved by Pastor Carl.

Benevolence - Mike Hart

The total disbursement for the 4th quarter (October – December) is \$5,440. Since Heart & Hands Ministries has become an independent 501 (c) (3) organization, it can no longer function through the First Baptist Church. So it has requested that the locally supportive churches donate monthly to its outreach activities. Our benevolence committee will have to decide whether to add a monetary donation to our current cost of providing bread for the pantry distributions (about \$100 a month). In January, this committee will have its first face-to-face meeting since COVID -19 restrictions started.

Personnel/Finance - Debby Aldridge

Pastor Carl's contract for 2023 has been approved, as it will remain the same until his retirement at the end of June. It has been submitted to Grace Presbytery. When people ask her about how the search for a new pastor is proceeding, she tells them that our Session is following the Presbytery's recommended procedure. A document from Presbytery to initiate a formal search will be submitted before the end of the year. She suggested that Randy Kemp serve as chairman of the Pastoral Search Committee, as he has had past experience in that role. He agreed to take that position.

Final 2023 Budget - Pat Hart

She passed out a report with three columns, showing the 2022 Budget, the 2022 Forecast, and the Preliminary 2023 Budget. The 3rd column had total income for 2023 at \$130,120 and expenses at \$123,260, leaving a net income of \$6,860. She cited a future increase in our phone bill, which changed the total expenses to \$123,452, making the net income \$6,668. Then Randy explained that expected roof repairs will require \$6,500 more in 2023. This additional item would change the net income to \$168.

After the Session's vote to approve the Final 2023 Budget, Pastor Carl Thompson said that part of the Memorial Fund can be used to pay for the roof, and that we have been looking for such a worthy project. The motion to approve the payment of this expense with restricted funds was passed. At the Congregational Meeting on January 29th, this transaction will appear as an expense under Building and Grounds on the 2023 Budget and as a withdrawal from restricted funds on the Balance Sheet.
