Carl's Comments - Reverend Carl Thompson

Summer Bible Study Starting Thursday, June 30

She considers the Sabbath to be a blessing, not a burden, and she believes that it can inspire us to do our best in everything we do.



Each of the nine weekly lessons will focus on a particular passage of scripture from either the Old or New Testaments without having a single storyline, but eventually developing into each participant's own story, with help from the Holy Spirit. Lesson One will feature Sabbath as a celebration of our relationship to God and His Son, Jesus Christ. It begins with recognizing Jesus as the Lord of the Sabbath and being willing to learn about how to celebrate it.
