





May 11th Health Fair to Benefit Heart & Hands

The Salado Health Fair on Saturday, May 11th, from 8 AM to Noon, will benefit the Heart & Hands Ministries. Its sponsor is the Salado Care Clinic, which is located in the former location of the Sewing Basket. You will find the Health Fair set up in the parking lot of the Mill Creek Center, between ABC Pest Control and ACE Hardware. Various health-related booths will provide information about healthcare providers in Salado, plus free blood pressure & blood sugar checks and 5-minute massages.

Donations will be accepted for the Heart & Hands' pantry and clothing shop. Food, health

aids, and summer clothing will be collected at the fair that day. **Suggested food items** include desserts; flour, sugar & cornbread; mayonnaise, mustard & ketchup; breakfast



foods like cereals, breakfast bars & Poptarts; and meaty soups, ramen noodles, chili, ravioli & spaghetti sauce. **Helpful heath aids** include soaps, razors, deodorant, toothpaste, and toothbrushes. **Summer clothing** for men, women and children would also be appreciated. If you cannot attend the Health Fair, you may still leave your donations in the narthex of our church at any time.
