Adult Bible Study -Shirley Pinkston



But frankly, I'm not so worried about the turkey. Don't get me wrong. I do love a good turkey. But what bothers me most is the fact that people seem to have forgotten what "Thanksgiving" is really all about. It shouldn't be that hard to remember. The word itself says it all. **THANKS GIVING.**

When my grandchildren were little, on Thanksgiving Day, while the women were preparing the meal, each person was given a card with a picture of a turkey on it, and a name written at the top. They were asked to write

When they were finished, the cards were placed on the dining room table. After the family was seated, each person in turn, read aloud what was on his or her card.
