Certain mission commitments, especially the Presbyterian Children's Homes and Presbyterian Disaster Relief, have been continued during each quarter in 2020, even though the Benevolence Committee could not meet in person. Recently \$5,700 additional distributions for the 3rd quarter have been decided by email vote, and our treasurer, John Pettijohn, has sent additional donations to other agencies. The recipients included Austin Theological Seminary, AWARE, Body of Christ Medical & Dental Clinics, Doctors without Borders, Families in Crisis, Fisher House at Fort Hood, Salado Fire Department, Salvation Army/Temple, and Samaritan's Purse.

Some Tips from Doctor Bev Koops Jones

Dear friends in the Presbyterian Church of Salado:

Here are some tips from your Affiliate Member (Bev) in Kill Devil Hills, NC. I am working with several other medical professionals in our church to publish COVID-19 tips weekly - here are some basics. Like all of you, I am trying to read through the many messages about attending large gatherings and safely reopening churches.

Here are some public health absolutes:

• Wear Masks to protect other people: Your nose and mouth should never be exposed!




 Wash Hands 20 seconds with soap and water to protect yourself: We all touch our faces!



• Wait 6 Feet Apart: Large Droplets, (Diameter of a Hair), like Windex Spray, are pulled down by Gravity.



 However, Aerosol drops (under 10 microns), like smoke, can float 25-30 feet.



Other safety suggestions are from two leading civil engineers, Dr. Richard Corsi and Dr. Linsey Marr. Their advice is available on Peoples Pharmacy, Podcast #1227.

To safely reopen sanctuary worship, they recommended the use of MERV13 filters in our buildings, testing central AC/Heating units for air flow of at least 300 cubic feet per minute, and placing air purifiers in the office.

September 1, 2020 Session Meeting Notes - Pat Hart

The Presbyterian Church of Salado held a stated session meeting on September 1, 2020.

- John Pettijohn, Treasurer, reported that our investment earnings are up which has balanced out the loss of offering income.
- Adult education will resume when it is deemed safe.
- New bulbs have been replaced in the sanctuary and activity room for better and more efficient lighting.
- We agreed that no singing or choir would be part
 of worship until a vaccine becomes widely available. We also reaffirmed Rev. Thompson's authority to determine when it is safe to resume inperson worship. At this time, October 11 has
 been set as a tentative date.
- The annual financial audit was completed and nominees for two session positions will be announced at the October meeting.
- The security audit determined that our rooms and exit doors need to be numbered and an updated diagram of the building be given to the Salado Police Department. Response training will be given to the congregation at a future date.

- The session also voted to continue funding the twice-weekly yoga classes in the activity room as a community outreach. They will resume when it is determined safe to do so.
- Our next stated session meeting will be held after worship on October 11, 2020.
