
## About our Members (and Prayer Requests)

## **Adult Bible Study -Shirley Pinkston**




"Jesus loves me this I know..." "Love divine, all love excel ling..." "Love lifted me..." "More love to thee, O Christ..." "Wonderful story of love, tell it to me again..."

From early childhood, we sing many songs about love, so we are aware of how important love is in the Christian life. We begin our Bible studies this year with an in-depth look at I Corinthians, Paul's New Testament letter to the Corinthians that contains what we commonly refer to as the "Love Chapter," I Corinthian 13. This chapter ends with these words:

"And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love."

The Corinthian Christ followers were trying a new social experiment, a Christian community in the middle of the first-century "sin city." This church was dealing with



many issues that plague today's churches, and the study will help us apply the lessons Paul taught to our problems today.

The title of our book is <u>I Corinthians:</u> <u>Searching the Depths of God</u>, by Jaime Clark-Soles, an ordained minister who is a Professor of New Testament and Distinguished Professor of Theology at Southern Methodist University. She will help us do the hard work of reading what can sometimes be a culturally confusing text. She wrote: "Paul's writings in I Corinthians teaches us a logic that depends on love..."

Classes begin at 9:00 a.m. Sunday, September 11 in the adult classroom. Coffee and cookies will be available as we share God's word and fellowship together. Everyone is welcome. Books are available at the church for you to pick up by September 4th.
